An American actor, film producer, director, activist and author, Stephen is the youngest of the seven siblings. His brothers, Alec, Daniel and William, all actors, are collectively known as the Baldwin Brothers.

Stephen was raised in the Catholic faith. He attended public school where his father was a sports coach. Later he attended the American Academy of Dramatic Arts.

He is best known for a starring role in the double-Oscar winning The Usual Suspects as well as Flintstones in Viva Rock Vegas, and cult comedy classics like Bio-Dome and Threesome. Stephen also starred in the television series The Young Riders and as himself in the reality shows Celebrity Big Brother 7.

What I did not know, Stephen, a multi-talented tour de force, owns several motorcycles and has participated in numerous celebrity races and frequently performs his own car/motorcycle stunts in his films.

Past experiences of numerous rendezvous with other celebrities taught me to manage my expectations carefully. When Stephen and I met at Michael's Restaurant in New York, I was in for a surprise. STEPHEN:

I better embrace it! Listen, for better or worse, I am in Show Business. Yes, I have my personal missions, my faith, my family, but I make my core living from the entertainment industry.

STEPHEN:

STEPHEN

My wife influences me constantly, in the best possible way. The smartest thing I ever did was to marry Kennya 34 years ago this July!

AVA: Your book, titled The Unusual Suspect, details events from your personal life, career, and your history with substance abuse. Did you turn toward faith as a source of inspiration?

STEPHEN

Yes. That is a very open and honest look at who I was then. It took a lot of personal strength, and as they say I have "done the work."

AVA: Did you become a born-again Evangelical to overcome the demons of your past?


STEPHEN:


